Indiana's low-cost, pro-business environment enabled the Indiana Economic Development Corporation to continue to attract new jobs and business investment to the state in 2009.

In 2009, 160 companies from across the state, country or world chose Indiana for their job-creating investments over other counties or states. These companies have committed to invest \$1.96 billion in Indiana and create 19,955 new jobs at an hourly wage of \$20.95, which was substantially above the 2009 statewide average wage of \$18.32 per hour.


The IEDC uses an aggressive and strategic approach to attract and encourage new business investment and job attraction in Indiana. In 2009 the IEDC also focused on attracting companies that were looking to consolidate manufacturing plants or facilities to reduce business costs. As a result, the IEDC was able to attract 51 competitive

consolidation projects, involving \$227 million in capital investment, which will create 5,550 new Indiana jobs.

Automotive-related manufacturing represented the largest sector for new job commitments in 2009 with 5,498 new jobs committed. Non-automotive manufacturing was the second-largest industry sector with 3,893 new job commitments, while Indiana's life science industry accounted for nearly 2,000 new job commitments.


Since Governor Mitch Daniels established the IEDC in early 2005, the agency has worked with more than 800 companies to grow or expand their operations in Indiana. The IEDC secured competitive job commitments totaling 18,659 in 2008, 22,627 in 2007 and 21,995 in 2006. Collectively, these companies have committed to create more than 100,000 new jobs in Indiana and invest more than \$21.3 billion in their Indiana operations.

### Job Commitments




\* Most current information reported by companies to the IEDC reflects a 13% reduction factor associated with projects which have not moved forward due to business or macroeconomic reasons.

### Competitive Projects




### Average Hourly Wages of New Jobs

Indiana continues to focus on establishing the nation's most attractive economic environment. This involves maintaining the state's nationally recognized position as a low-cost, pro-business destination for business investment, avoiding general tax increases, and preserving Indiana's overall fiscal stability.

Indiana continued to garner national attention for its competitive business climate in 2009. Here are a few examples:

- Indiana ranks first in the Midwest and 12th nationally for business tax climate. (Tax Foundation, September)
- Indiana is the best state in the Midwest for business and 11th best nationally. (*Chief Executive* magazine, March)
- Indiana has the ninth best business climate in the nation. (*Site Selection* magazine, November)
- Indiana ranks first in the Midwest and seventh nationally for low business costs. (*Forbes* magazine, September)

In September, Governor Mitch Daniels led dozens of Indiana business and community leaders on an investment mission to China and Japan for the IEDC's sixth overseas mission since 2005.

Indiana's team met with hundreds of business leaders and dozens of international companies, including some of Indiana's major internationally owned firms, during the 10-day trip. The governor also attended the annual joint meeting of the Midwest U.S.-Japan Association and Japan-Midwest U.S. Association in Tokyo.

International companies in 2009 committed to invest \$143 million into their Indiana operations and to create more than 1,800 new jobs.

Closer to home, the IEDC in 2009 met with more than 85 site selection consultants and industry and company leaders during a series of domestic business development events and meetings designed to entice out-of-state businesses to consider locating, expanding or consolidating in Indiana. The business development meetings were held in Dallas (February), New York (May), Chicago (August) and Atlanta (September).

The IEDC also led numerous engagement efforts throughout 2009. These include:

  - Industrial Asset Management Council Forums, Asheville, North Carolina (May) and Minneapolis, Minnesota (September)
  - Society of Industrial and Office Realtors Conferences, San Diego, California (April) and Toronto, Ontario, Canada (October)

In 2009, the IEDC reassessed Indiana's strategic entrepreneurial assets and how those assets are used to enhance entrepreneurial activities and attract business investment and new job creation to Indiana. The IEDC also began deploying proven economic development models and tools to bring structurally progressive changes to the state's entrepreneurial environment.

The IEDC also reevaluated the role of the 21st Century Research and Technology Fund (21 Fund) as a tool used to bring high technology ideas to commercial life. Beginning in April, the 21 Fund concentrated on helping develop high growth companies by leveraging direct 21 Fund investments to engage private capital. This has effectively moved the 21 Fund closer to the market and integrated its awards with other private funding sources.

The 21 Fund in 2009 made 25 awards totaling more than \$26.4 million to Indiana ventures that are actively developing and commercializing innovative new products. These companies attracted an additional \$66.5 million in private capital as a result of the 21 Fund investments.

The IEDC identified The Small Business Innovation Research (SBIR) and Small Business Technology Transfer (STTR) programs as the primary entry point for early-stage companies and technology development into the 21 Fund's portfolio. Integrating these federal programs into support structure offered by the 21 Fund enhances federal funding of Indiana business development projects and effectively uses federal peer review to vet project merit.

The SBIR/STTR program provided approximately \$5.1 million to about 50 different Indiana small businesses in 2009. The IEDC also provided an additional \$1.6 million in matching support of SBIR/STTR Phase II projects. As SBIR/STTR projects develop beyond Phase II, it is expected that they will become eligible for direct 21 Fund commercialization enhancement awards.
